Meeting called to order – Josephine Liu at 6:30 pm

#### **Guest speaker: Councilmember Sarah Bagley**

- Lived in Alexandria for 6+ years
- Moved to region to get out of her car and took the Metro and bus
- Moved to Alexandria, felt less safe walking and bicycling than in Washington, DC
- From her work in affordable housing, people with lower incomes are less likely to us a car
- Suggested highlighting the environmental part of bicycling as a way to broaden the conversation and try to expand the thinking a bit to encourage and induce people
- Common reaction to her biking to an event is "I can't believe you rode here" which indicates the need for increased safety
  - we have an obligation in government to help people get around safely
- Eldon Does asked about Safe Routes to Schools program. Do you know much about that and if not, would you be interested in meeting to discuss it further?
  - Councilmember Bagley is familiar with Safe Routes to School and has participated in Bicycling in the Schools.
- Ken Notis asked about Complete Streets staffing
  - She planned to follow up with staff about Complete Streets staffing issues
- Judith Fogel suggested that the free buses not promoted enough to people
- Casey Kane asked about using local funds versus grant funds as the former is far easier for staff to administer while the latter is much more onerous. Many biking and walking projects are funded by grants.

• The group discussed how to encourage people to walk and bike for short trips

- Run a contest encouraging people to do small trips such as Transportation Bingo
- Could tie into the CHIP
- Profiling people who have gone car-free or car-lite
- Tout health and physical benefits for walking and bicycling
- Make it seem approachable by showing people "how to get from Old Town to Del Ray"
- David Bouk mentioned how to bike to certain locations and what to do the bicycle once you have arrived
- Promote people in the media who are profiled about being car-free
- Could show people how to spot racks on Rackspotter
- Upcoming Walks and Rides Josephine
  - Winter Bike to Work day this past Friday in St. Elmos in Del Ray
  - Bike Rodeos
    - Planning to host a bike rodeo on Sunday April 24, Earth Day will not happen due to COVID-19
  - Earth Month ride, tour about various green buildings and how they have met the various certification standards
  - Recent walks
    - Interested in National Walking day, first Wednesday in April 6 if people are interested, Judith can help mid-week, can led or walk
  - Woman's history month ride or walk at the end of March, Fibre Space and Ethiopian cafe in south Old Town
  - CHIP, no new activities but came up with a one page description of their work plan, to the Partnership for a Health
